KIRCHENWALD AND NAWAKWA MASTER SITE PLAN Updates Under Way



Have you ever thought about what Kirchenwald or Nawakwa will look like in 10, 30, or even 50 years? Have you even said to yourself, or to a friend, "Wouldn't it be great if camp would build - *insert your idea here*?"

In essence, that's what master site planning is all about. The process started in September with a design team composed of LCC staff and architects Christina Kincaid and Donald Main. The team assessed the facilities and features of each camp to get a complete and accurate understanding of them and their condition. The team identified immediate, medium term, and longer term maintenance needs and concerns for existing facilities. A constituent survey was conducted in December to learn what our guests and users think about the camp sites, their facilities, and what facilities are desired for future ministry. The team wrestled with this information and with priorities set forth in the recently completed Strategic Plan to begin shaping what facilities the camps will need to conduct ministry well into the future. Most recently, five constituent town hall meetings were conducted to share these ideas, answer questions, gather more input, and find out which projects people feel are most important.

Visit the LCC website to view a pdf of the master site plans and capital projects shared in the recent town hall meetings. Please remember, this remains a work in progress.

The process will continue into the spring, with further refinements. A report, including master site plans, project drawings, and project cost estimates, will be presented to the board of directors at the June meeting. Once the master site plans are adopted by the board, a new process will begin to raise funds needed to achieve project improvements, renovations, and new construction, as prioritized by the board. As one town hall meeting attendee said, "This is really exciting work that will make a difference well into the future!"

CAMP STAFF SCHOLARSHIP ESTABLISHED

Long-time family campers, Daryl and Maggie Ackerman, know very well that the experiences summer camp staff gain working at camp will benefit them throughout the rest of their lives. They know that those who work on summer camp staff at Kirchenwald and Nawakwa gain all sorts of valuable skills and experiences. Summer staff are critical to the faith-based camp experiences of our campers, and research shows that working in a faithbased camp has often led to future work in church ministry. Knowing all this, Daryl and Maggie established the Lutheran Camping Corporation of Central PA Camp Staff Scholarship Fund at the Foundation for Enhancing Communities (TFEC) as a way to encourage Kirchenwald and Nawakwa summer camp staff members in their continuing education. Presently one scholarship of \$1000 is awarded annually to an individual who served the previous summer at either Kirchenwald or Nawakwa. Growing the scholarship fund at TEFC could eventually allow multiple awards to be made. WITTEL FARM GROWING PROJECT'S TENTH SEASON: Planting, Growing, and Sharing as acts of discipleship

In 2016, we launched the growing project to respond to a need for fresh, locally grown food in our community. We partnered with the Lancaster County Food Hub to distribute thousands of pounds of vegetables to food-insecure households. Over nine growing seasons, we have shared more than 133,000 pounds of vegetables and collaborated with a dozen local food relief distributors. Our harvest serves thousands of families in Lancaster and Lebanon counties.

The Wittel Farm has become the most significant provider of freshly grown local food within the county's food relief system. We are the only nonprofit, farm-based ministry that produces a diverse vegetable crop to combat food insecurity as a practice of discipleship. We give away our harvest because we believe that food is a gift to share, a blessing from the earth and our Creator, meant to nourish our neighbors.

We view this ministry and the practice of agriculture as a vital and unique expression of faith within Lutheran outdoor ministry. Jesus was an agrarian teacher, using parables of sowing seeds, harvesting crops, and feeding the hungry to reveal deeper truths. These parables come to life in a tangible way when we cast seeds into the soil, harvest food to share, or take part in distributing the harvest.

Our work is also informed by the emerging field of ecotheology, which recognizes the God of the Bible as one who is in covenant with God's people through the land. With campers, families, youth groups, and congregations, we provide enriching experiences that connect faith with action. Through monthly dinner church worship and campfires, we bring the farm to the table, seeing it as a blessing from God—a sacrament of the earth.

Since 2021, more than 500 volunteers have joined us each summer, allowing us to expand production while also recognizing the natural limits of the land. A relationship with the land requires attentiveness and respect. We ask: What does the land need from us now? We acknowledge that a sabbath rhythm is essential to maintaining a healthy ecosystem—honoring limits, fostering rest, and respecting the seasons.

We are also mindful of those who came before us on this land—the Wittel family, who entrusted us with this gift, and the Indigenous peoples who inhabited and carefully stewarded it for centuries. Gratitude for their legacy reminds us to consider how our actions today will impact future generations. What we do now must be for the sake of the grandchildren who will inherit this land.

Along the way, we have adopted sustainable and regenerative gardening practices to protect the soil and the farm's ecology. This year, we are establishing several permanent garden beds to better manage weeds, water, and harvesting. We are also planting forty additional native trees and a wildflower meadow. Our summer farm manager intern, Alex, will be starting raised beds and a Three Sisters garden—featuring corn, beans, and squash—as a demonstration of gardening techniques that can be used at home or in congregations.

Discipleship calls us to follow Christ in service to the land and to our neighbors, both human and non-human. By learning gardening skills and cultivating food to share, we participate in the abundant generosity of creation.

The Wittel Farm Pavilion is a special gathering place where we cultivate community. Our well-equipped kitchen is available for use by congregations and families.

We are currently in our planting season and will continue through the fall. Visit the Wittel Farm website for information about events and pavilion rentals.

Looking ahead, we are excited to introduce three new features to the farm:

- A dedicated irrigation well and system to improve water management
- A 20' x 48' high tunnel greenhouse to extend our growing season
- A portable chicken coop to house 20 laying hens, providing eggs for distribution and manure to enrich the soil

We believe the Wittel Farm is a gift that the Lutheran Camping Corporation is called to share through agricultural faith formation. As we enter our tenth growing season, we look forward to planting, growing, and sharing with you!

Two Creative Options to include LCC in your Estate Planning

Retirement and pension plans are critical elements of one's financial plan. They can also be substantial elements of a legacy gift plan (sometimes referred to as an estate plan). Well-executed retirement plans, which may include a 401k, 403b, or a traditional or Roth IRA, allow people to live comfortably once they've stopped working. They can also be used to make a significant charitable gift to support LCC ministries.

Giving from a retirement fund is easy. You simply make the LCC a beneficiary of the plan. A beneficiary designation form can be obtained from your retirement plan custodian. You can give the entire amount held in a specific account or a percentage of it. Making a charity, like LCC, a beneficiary of a retirement account doesn't impact one's retirement income, as the charity receives the donation after the donor passes. Your legacy lives on when the designated portion of the funds are paid to the LCC.

A gift of life insurance is also easy. Doing so provides benefits to both you and our joyful and faith building outdoor ministry. There are a number of ways you can make such a gift.

One way is to assign ownership of an existing policy you no longer need to LCC. You receive a charitable deduction for the present value of the policy and LCC ministries benefit from the full proceeds of the policy at your death.

A second way is to take out a new policy with LCC as the owner and beneficiary. You then make an annual, tax-deductible gift to LCC to pay the premium. The gift is fully protected in the event of an early death, and you never have to pay as much in premiums as LCC receives from the policy.

A third way to make a one-time deductible gift to the LCC is to purchase a single premium life insurance policy. The cost would be less to you by doing this and you would not have the trouble of paying premiums monthly, quarterly, or annually.
